1. What can you reasonably conclude from this chart?
  - a. The greatest demand for wheat is in August.
  - b. The least demand for wheat is in January.
  - c. Exports rose from March until August.
  - d. Countries can make large amounts of money by exporting wheat.
2. Which of the following statements is true?
  - a. The greatest decline in wheat exportations came in September.
  - b. Wheat exportation increased in March.
  - c. More wheat is exported in the winter than in the summer.
  - d. Monthly wheat exports commonly topped 5,000,000 tons.
3. If it takes wheat six months to grow and be harvested, which of the following statements is most likely true?
  - a. Heaviest planting should take place in the summer months.
  - b. Heaviest planting should take place in the winter months.
  - c. More workers will be needed in winter months.
  - d. Heaviest planting needs to take place immediately after large exports are made.
